Art-making Project "A Day in the Life"

Try your hand at photojournalism by documenting "A Day in the Life" of someone you are quarantined with. (Pets count too!) Peter Keady, who took the photographs in *Smoke Eaters*, typically focuses on struggles and growth in life. Can you show the struggles and growth of your subject during quarantine?

What You'll Need:

A digital camera, or a smartphone with a camera, or even a computer or tablet with a webcam!

If you don't have access to a camera, get creative and draw or paint your subject using paper and pencils instead!

What to Do:

- Get your subject's permission to photograph them.
- Take photos of them throughout the day (or week).
- Try to take some candid shots while they aren't paying attention. This can be of fun moments laughing or playing, or while they are working or doing chores around the house, or more!
- Take some pictures of their environment. This could be their bedroom, their workstation at home, their car, or any other place or thing that represents them.
- Once you've taken all your pictures for the day, pick your favorites to include in your series.
