

What is Musikfest?

Musikfest is the nation's largest free-admission festival, with more than 500 performances on 15 stages over 10 days every August. Founded in 1984 by ArtsQuest, a community-based nonprofit organization, the first Musikfest featured 295 performances on six stages, attracting more than 180,000 people to historic Bethlehem.

Over the past three decades, the event has evolved into one of the largest and most diverse music festivals in the nation, with more than 350 performers taking the stage during the event's 10-day run. Each year nearly one million people make their way to the Lehigh Valley and the festival, with their sights set on experiencing all the music, food and fun of this musical extravaganza.

How many people do you expect?

Attendance at the past six festivals has been near or more than one million visitors, with last year's attendance being 957,000. Guests came from more than 35 states, as well as 10 different countries.

When should we be set up by?

We ask all vendors to be setup and ready for the festers a 1/2 prior to the start of Musikfest.



Where do we park?

Parking on the festival grounds is coordinated by Nicole Dotta at ndotta@artsquest.org, Nicholas Michael at nmichael@artsquest.org or Chris Kobela at ckobela@artsquest.org. Parking is at a premium and we are only able to supply limited passes each day.

What are your sampling guidelines?

Liquid samples must be 2oz or less. Solid food samples must be 1.5oz or less.

What kind of security and medical staff will you have at the festival?

We have 24-hour ArtsQuest Event Staff and also employ the Bethlehem Police Department for on-site security on both sides of the festival; however, this does not mean there will be coverage at all times for your activation. Health tents, located on both sides of the festival, are staffed with Lehigh Valley Health Network personnel. Ambulances are present on both sides and staffed with trained first responders. If there is an emergency always call 911.

Do I need permits?

Are there restrictions on what I can giveaway?

You may not sell or give away food and/or drink. Any planned activities or giveaways at the festival must be approved by ArtsQuest.

Where are the restrooms?

North Side – Porta-johns are located in Familienplatz, at the corner of W. Lehigh St. & Main St., Festplatz, Volksplatz and W. Walnut St.

South Side – Restrooms are located in the ArtsQuest Center on the first floor past the bar and on the first floor of the Visitor Center.

Insurance

ArtsQuest must have a copy of a certificate of commercial general liability from your organization. It should name ArtsQuest as an additional insured, with minimum coverage of \$1 million per person, per incident.

Is there a lost and found?

Yes, they are located at the following locations:

North Side – Base Radio location (location TBD). At night all unclaimed objects are taken to the Banana Factory.

South Side - The ArtsQuest Center front desk.

What is there to eat at the 'fest?

We pride ourselves on having an outstanding selection of 60 vendors throughout the festival including snacks, entrées and desserts! We challenge you to try as many different foods as possible.

Where can I get something to drink?

We have Coca-Cola Stations throughout the festival grounds where you can purchase water, soda, iced tea and energy drinks. You are not allowed to consume alcoholic beverages while working the event.

Is smoking allowed at the festival?

Smoking in any tented areas, indoor venues or Sands Steel Stage seating sections is prohibited.

Can I watch the festival on television?

Yes! Service Electric Cable TV has an immense amount of coverage on its channel before, during and after the festival!

What's up with the food/beverage tickets?

These tickets help us get through the lines quicker and increase the fluidity of the event. You only need to use them on the North Side. The vendors on the South Side take tickets, cash and cards.

I see a lot of people carrying mugs!

The Musikfest Mug is a staple of the festival. Every year there is a new design, which has prompted Musikfest's faithfuls to begin a collection! The mug itself gets you a discount on beer and keeps your beer cold. It also helps reduce the waste generated.

Are you ADA compliant?

All Musikfest stages are accessible to persons with disabilities and offer areas for ADA seating. The Sands Steel Stage offers ADA seating at the venue's soundboard; tickets for this section may be purchased by contacting the ArtsQuest Box Office at 610-332-3378.

What is ArtsQuest?

ArtsQuest is a Bethlehem-based nonprofit dedicated to presenting music, arts, festivals, cultural experiences and educational and outreach programs that aid in economic development, urban revitalization and community enrichment. Through festivals such as its flagship event, Musikfest; the Banana Factory Arts Center; and the ArtsQuest Center and SteelStacks arts and cultural campus, ArtsQuest's programming reaches more than 1.5 million people annually. The organization's programs and events, approximately 65 percent of which are free to attend, have a combined economic impact of more than \$117 million annually in the region.

What are SteelStacks & Bethlehem Steel?

SteelStacks is a 10-acre campus dedicated to arts, culture, family events, community celebrations, education and fun. Once the home plant of Bethlehem Steel, the second largest steel manufacturer in the nation, the site has been reborn through music and art, offering more than 1,000 concerts and 12 different festivals annually.

Inside the ArtsQuest Center at SteelStacks are The Frank Banko Alehouse Cinemas, a two-screen independent, foreign and arthouse cinema; and The Musikfest Café presented by Yuengling, a dynamic concert venue. With an awe-inspiring, bird's-eye view of the historic Bethlehem Steel blast furnaces, the past and present converge in this music lover's paradise and multi-purpose concert venue. At night the ArtsQuest Center is truly special, with its floor to ceiling windows that look out onto the beautifully lit furnaces. The Musikfest Café can also accommodate more 400 guests for a dining event.

The Visitor Center and the National Museum of Industrial History are both within walking distance of the ArtsQuest Center and offer an even more in depth story of the Bethlehem Steel. Check out www.steelstacks.org for more about the history of the site and the SteelStacks campus.

What can I do in Bethlehem?
